Our history

On Australia Day we reflect on the pivotal day in the history of our ancient continent.

It is a day to acknowledge past wrongs while we show respect and celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples' survival, resilience and enduring culture.

It is a day to respect the deep connection to Country that First Nations people still feel to this day and to reflect on how we are all defined by the land on which we live, work and play, from the freshwater to the saltwater, the rainforest to the desert.

Australia Day 2023

Just as there are those who are concerned about the date and what it means for First Nations people, there are those for whom the day holds great meaning.

Australia Day is a day to reflect on our history and learn from the experiences of others. We are privileged to live in a nation where we can all have our views, values and beliefs.

Changing the date will not change history, we need to change how we observe the day.

Reflect

- Australia Day begins with reflection, on our history and the 65,000 years of history and continuous culture that thrived on this land before European settlement.
 - Australia Day is a day to learn more about our true history. Many will gather at services in cities and towns around the nation to stand with First Nations Australians in moments of mourning, truth-telling and celebration of timeless and enduring culture.
 - These events are an opportunity to join in the time-honoured practice of storytelling to preserve language, history and culture.

Respect

- We can show our respect by gathering with family, friends, and community at a local Australia Day event or citizenship ceremony.
- We can take a quiet moment to respect that we are privileged to belong to a nation that is free, inclusive and multicultural

Celebrate

- On Australia Day, we celebrate being part of a proud, ancient, multicultural nation that values the contribution of each and every citizen.
- We celebrate thousands of generations of enduring culture and survival, learn more about the Country we live on and listen and learn from Indigenous ways of being and doing.
- We celebrate surrounded by friends, family and community, at home, at an event, at the beach or in the park.
- We can celebrate over a meal. There's nothing more Australian than sharing a meal, whether its banh mi or a burger, a souvlaki or a snag or a pho or a pavlova. It's about connection and community.

Australia Day Ambassador Program

The Australia Day Ambassador Program is one of the longest running and most successful national Australia Day Programs sending high achieving Australians to over 300 community celebrations nationwide every Australia Day.

Ambassadors are past recipients of the Australian of the Year Awards, sportspeople, scientists, businesspeople, actors and community workers who provide inspiration and pride to Australia Day events and activities.

The 2023 Australia Day Community Grants program

The National Australia Day Council is once again – with the support of the Federal Government – providing community grants to eligible councils and organisations to host events on Australia Day 2023.

Australia Day event hosts had the opportunity to apply for up to \$20,000 to deliver events that use the National Australia Day Council's 'Reflect. Respect. Celebrate. We're all part of the story.' branding.

Applicants that collaborate with local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities to incorporate activities that reflect and respect the history of local Indigenous people and celebrate their culture were eligible to apply for up to an additional \$10,000.

COVID Safe events

In the weeks leading up to Australia Day all event hosts should remind themselves of any COVID Safe regulations in place in their state or territory.
